- **Identity-in-Christ pathway (opt-in) or values-based pathway** (public settings)
- **Indigenous co-designed options** following OCAP® principles

To restore **identity, courage, and spiritual clarity** in the next generation through evidence-informed, culturally respectful programs that are safe, measurable, and scalable.

Assemblies, intensives, full-day programs, and multi-week series.
